

## SEPTIC TANK AND SEWAGE HOLDING TANK INSTALLATION DECLARATION

Septic and sewage holding tanks may have specific requirements for installation in order to maintain their CSA certification. Under the Sewage Disposal Systems Regulation septic and sewage holding tanks must be CSA certified. Product suppliers should be able to provide these requirements.

Complete this form and return to Environmental Health Services within 30 days of installation of the sewage disposal system. Failure to do so may result in delays in issuing Approval to Use.
