FUNDING SUPPORTS WOMEN'S EQUALITY WORK

WHITEHORSE - Minister responsible for the Women's Directorate Elaine Taylor announced today continued funding of \$175,000 towards advancing women's equality in the North. This represents the second year of funding to women's organizations for a total of \$520,000 over three years.

"Through the Women's Equality Fund, the Yukon government has significantly increased resources available to women's organizations in support of their work to enhance women's equality while meeting the government's commitment to gender equality in Yukon," Taylor said. "We support the grass roots work being undertaken by women and are pleased to provide longer-term sustainable funding in this regard."

In 2007, the Women's Equality Fund supported human rights research and outreach, violence prevention work, promotion of housing research, increasing the skill sets of Yukon tradeswomen and enhancing public awareness of aboriginal women and governance.

"This government initiative has been instrumental in empowering women to be engaged in this critical juncture of Kaska governance," Liard Aboriginal Women's Society Executive Director Ann Maje Raider said. "As a result, Kaska women are ensuring that the Kaska government is built on the principles of fairness, accountability and inclusiveness. Their participation will protect the matrilineal lines in the Kaska national government and institutions."

In 2008, the fund will provide \$35,000 to the Liard Aboriginal Women's Society, \$35,000 to the Whitehorse Aboriginal Women's Society, \$35,000 to Les EssentiElles, \$35,000 to Yukon Women in Trades and Technology, \$13,500 to Victoria Faulkner Women's Centre and \$20,000 to the Yukon Status of Women Council.

The Women's Equality Fund is administered by the Women's Directorate.
